Application Fee	£25	Payable by all applicants at the point of application. For UK students, this fee should accompany your application. Overseas students please contact TRINITY admissions.
Tuition Deposit	£100	Payable to secure a place at the College, but deducted from first term's fees. This deposit is payable only when you accept the offer of a place at TRINITY. Do not pay before a place is offered, you will be advised when payment is due.
Tuition fee	£3,290 (EU) £8,250 (Non EU)	Annual cost of all tuition  The full fees for Non-EU students are £8,250 but TRINITY offers Non- EU students bursaries which are applied for on an individual basis
Library fee	£350	Annual fee to cover use of School library

## Supporting Notes for Fees 2010-2011

### Terms of Payment

- **Payment Responsibilities**

All EU students are required to pay their first-term fees in advance, and must show evidence (supporting letters from sponsors, bank account status, student loans evidence etc.) of how they will support the full payment of fees each term thereafter. Non-EU students must make their first year payment in full before a CAS number will be issued.

If you withdraw from your course during the year, full fees will be due for the whole term in which you withdrew even if only one day into the term. Registration fees cannot be refunded.

If you have problems in paying fees, or require financial assistance or information, please contact in the first place the Admissions Administrator. There are bursaries available to help support international students registering with Trinity, however the responsibility for paying fees remains with the student. (Refer to *Funding your future* document).

If students fail to pay their fees and incur bad debts with Trinity, a financial repayment agreement will be set up with Trinity's Finance department. It will also affect the eligibility of students to proceed with their studies beyond year one and subsequent placements for final year degree students. Trinity will endeavour to support all students in prayer around payment of fees and will be sensitive to each individual case.

### Discounts

- **Advance payment**

Students who wish to pay for the whole year's fees in full are eligible for a discount of 3%. To qualify the first terms fees must be paid in advance of the autumn term.

- **Married Couples**

A discount of 15% applies to the tuition fees of one partner if both are studying for a full-time course at the College. This discount applies to couples who are married before commencing the course but also to students who get married during the course. The discount will apply from the beginning of the term following their marriage.

This discount applies to tuition fees only.

To receive this discount a written application must be made prior to the start of term in which the discount is to apply.

### Miscellaneous Charges

- Photocopying and Printing: £0.05p per copy
- Telephoning: Students have to cover the cost of all calls made.
- Course work transcripts: An admin fee for the production of transcript marks is £10
